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There was brief discussion regarding the solar panels at Ty Nant regarding the listed building status which the Clerk confirmed was Grade 2. No objection was raised.

### 22/150 DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORTS

District Councillor, Mayor J Pritchard reported:

- 1. There was no further news re The Eden Project.
- 2. The UKSFP Rural Fund was available for projects that support the aims of the government's Levelling Up White Paper and Future Farming Programme. It funds capital projects for small businesses and community infrastructure. The aim was to help to improve productivity and strengthen the rural economy and rural communities.
- 3. The Boundaries Commission were proposing to merge the Lower Lune Valley with Morecambe and Lunesdale which also takes in Sedbergh and Kirkby Lonsdale.
- 4. The Mayor had attended a 'Food Futures' event and was surprised to find she was the only non-vegetarian at the event.
- 5. From mid-January 2023 the Elections Act 2022 will require voters in Great Britain to show photo ID before being issued a ballot paper in polling stations at UK Parliamentary elections, local council elections and referendums in England and police and crime commissioner elections in England and Wales. The Mayor was uncertain how the legislation affected postal voting.

### County Councillor: Matthew Maxwell-Scott reported:

- 1. There was a strain on Highway's budgets regarding repairs owing to a 27% increase in the cost of road repairs, partly because of the UK's bitumen having come chiefly from Russia.
- 2. New average speed cameras were to be installed on the A6 and A603
- 3. He held a small fund (£2000 p.a.) to distribute for local special causes. Money could be applied for on the Lancashire County Council, Member's Grants web page.

#### Parish Councillors asked:

- 1. What was happening about the South Lancaster/M6 Link Road? The County Councillor stated the project was likely to take 20 years and at a current cost of £160m. The money would have to be clawed back by a roof tax on new developers if current planned housing in the area went ahead. It was noted that the University had cut back their expansion plans.
- 2. What was the cost and benefit of a Parish Planning Document. The Mayor stated that Caton had just completed theirs and the cost was around £10,000, but grants were available. The benefits were community consultation and involvement were required and the City Council must recognise the outcomes of the plan when making decisions.
