Appeal Description: Appeal against enforcement notice issued for the engineering development consisting of land

level changes and creation of hardstanding areas

An appeal has been made to the Secretary of State on 16.06.2025, against an Enforcement Notice issued by Lancaster City Council, in respect of the above site. The appeal is made under Section 174 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 against enforcement action taken by the Council. This appeal will be decided by Written Representations. The procedure to be followed is set out in the Town and Country Planning (Enforcement) (Written Representations Procedure) (England) Regulations 2002

Grounds of Appeal

The appeal will proceed on ground A (that planning permission should be granted for what is alleged in the notice), ground C (that there has not been a breach of planning control) and ground F (the steps required to comply with the requirements of the notice are excessive and lesser steps would overcome the objections)

The reasons for issuing the notice are as follows:

- It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years.
- The unauthorised engineering works, consisting of considerable land level alterations and laying of concrete, by virtue of scale, siting and prominent location within the Forest of Bowland National Landscape and open countryside. The works are considered to represent a discordant and alien form that has jarred with and has caused harm to the character and appearance of the surrounding designated landscape and wider open landscape. Therefore, given that the site currently does not benefit from planning permission, the engineering operations that has been undertaken is unauthorised and causes harm for the reasons set out immediately above. The works fail to comply with Policies DM29, DM46 of the Development Management DPD, Policies EN2 and EN3 of the Strategic Policies and Land Allocations and Sections 12 and 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
